Joslin Diabetes Center and New England Dressage Association have joined hands to provide diabetes awareness and education to the equestrian community. Established in 1898, 23 years before insulin was identified, **Joslin Diabetes Center** has become the undisputed world leader in diabetic research, treatment, and patient and professional education. The Festival consists of five competitions, featuring 600 horses competing in classes from Training Level, the first step on the dressage ladder, to Grand Prix, the pinnacle of the sport as seen at the Olympic Games.

Within this event are the New England **Region 8 Regional Championships** sponsored by the Great American Insurance Group and United States Dressage Federation, and recognized by US Equestrian Federation. Championship classes will be held Thursday through Sunday, featuring freestyle championships on Friday and Sunday.

Secondly, this event is one of the few internationally recognized American competitions (**CDI-W Y/J Saugerties**) recognized by the Federation Equestre Internationale (FEI). International competitors earn scores toward representing their countries at competitions such as the World Games or the Olympics.

Thirdly, for the first time NEDA Fall Festival offers a second internationally recognized competition: an internationally recognized para equestrian CPEDI combined with the USEF Para Equestrian National Championship.

On Thursday afternoon these **International Competitions** begin with the formal inspection of the horses by FEI Officials, certifying their identity and their fitness to compete. Riders from Denmark, Israel, Germany, Netherlands, Sweden, Canada and other countries will compete. Classes are held Friday, Saturday, and Sunday with the **Grand Prix de Dressage** on Friday afternoon, the Grand Prix Freestyle on Saturday, and the Grand Prix special on Sunday morning.

Fourth, Tuesday afternoon, Wednesday all day and Thursday morning, in the **Sport Horse Breed Show** horses (from weanlings to stallions) are shown "in hand". There are special classes for Amateur Handlers, IBC classes for specific breeds of horses, and classes for ponies. The \$5,400 **New England Sport Horse Breeder's Futurity** is featured on Wednesday afternoon.. This competition is a both a qualifier for and regional finals for the **USDF Breeders Championship New England Series** also sponsored by Great American; finals classes will be held Thursday morning.

Finally, Thursday through Sunday a **National Competition** features hundreds of local competitors, amateurs and professionals, as well as riders who have competed international events. Within this competition, the **Fall Festival Dressage Sweepstakes** takes place, with final awards available late on Friday late afternoon. On Sunday high scoring performers will be selected for the **Adult Amateur Championships** and the **Junior/Young Rider Championships**.

Freestyles will be held both Saturday and Sunday, competitors riding their horses to music in specially choreographed programs reminiscent of the famous "dancing" Lipizzan horses of the Spanish Riding School in Vienna. Because there are very few competitions in this country featuring world class horses and musical rides, ringside will be packed with excited spectators. Everyone loves to watch!

A large **Equestrian Trade Fair** will be held, featuring artists, horse supplies, boutiques, trailers. **VIP Hospitality and Reserved Seating**, featuring morning and afternoon refreshments, is available duration of Dressage Show.

Take Mass Pike to end and NY Thruway south to Exit 20. After toll turn right onto Route 32 North and go 1 mile. Turn right onto Peoples Road and go 9/10 mile. Turn left after RR tracks onto Canoe Hill Road and go 5/10 mile. Canoe Hill becomes Mike Krout Road, 8/10 mile. Grounds will be 1 8/10 miles on right.
